
We will be using Skellig, Why the Whales Came and A Christmas Carol came as the stimulus for much of our English work this term.

How can you help?

Talk to your child about what they are reading. What do they like or dislike about it? What are the themes of the story? Which character do you like best and why?

Encourage them to use examples from the story itself. E.g. "I like Mina because she questions the constraints of education."

Please try to avoid watching the films with your child as this may be shown at the end of the Topic.





We will be writing:

- Extended chapters in role of a character.
- Instructions on how to feed a Skellig.
- Poetry in the style of William Blake.
- Predictive Flashbacks and Diary entry.
- Structured poetry (Haiku, Cinquain)
- Author study.

We will also be using drama to stimulate ideas for our writing.

Assessment

The children will sit a half termly test in reading and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling. This will inform future planning and teaching.

Science



We will be identifying how animals and plants are adapted to their environments and habitats.

Computing

In Computing, we will be creating a multimedia presentation comparing the UK to the Galapagos. We will also be looking at developing our knowledge of spreadsheets.







Geography

In Geography, we will be comparing and contrasting the UK with The Galapagos islands. We will look at the location of these islands and similarities and differences between climate, wildlife, land use and jobs. We will also look at the real life abandoned Skellig island and how islands are formed.







Art

In Art, we will be looking at real images of The Galapagos Islands and painting these in the style of Gauguin.



D&T

In D&T, we will be combining materials to design and make our treasure chest to hide on the island we are creating in geography. This will include using tools safely.

Music



In Music, we will be exploring the music genre Jazz and re-creating our version of the song 'Happy'.

PE

In our first half term, we will be developing our skills in fitness and netball.

After half term, we will be doing dodgeball and tag rugby.

French

In French, we will be introducing vocabulary for some extended family members and learning how to talk about household tasks and family-based weekend activities.



RE

In RE, we will be covering Islam and Christianity. In our topic of Islam, we will be particularly focusing on the Five Pillars of Islam and finding out more about what they represent. When focusing on Christianity, we will be looking at the impact of the Christmas and Easter story on specific people that were involved.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be looking at rights, rules, democracy and own responsibilities. We will also be looking at different kinds of friendships in a variety of settings.
